Storm Safety Checklist



SECURE YOUR PROPERTY AGAINST SEVERE WEATHER

From hail and heavy rain to hurricanes and blizzards, storms come in many shapes and sizes, and can happen almost anywhere. Regardless of the season, they can emerge suddenly and cause severe damage to your home or property.

BEFORE:

- Create (or restock) a disaster supply kit
- Safeguard important documents (certificates, tax documents, insurance policies, etc)
- Install storm shutters
- Bring in outdoor hazards (signs, chairs, bicycles, etc)
- Ensure your vehicle's gas tank is full



DURING:

- Turn off main power, propane tanks and appliances
- Stay indoors away from windows
- Listen to radio or TV for updates on the storm's progress
- Evacuate if advised to do so



AFTER:

- Check your property for signs of damage
- Keep clear of powerlines, fallen trees and debris
- Avoid touching floodwater
- Use a camera to document any damage before getting repairs
- Contact local authorities and contractors as needed

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR DISASTER SUPPLY KIT:

- Water
- Non-perishable food (canned goods, dry pasta, etc.)
- Flashlight
- Batteries
- First aid kit
- Blankets
- Clothing

- Personal hygiene items
- Portable radio
- Tools
- Maps of the local area
- Gas for your generator
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Can opener (for opening canned goods)
- Extra food and water for pets
